## **THE LOCALE AND THE ABODE:**

Established on 7th September, 1988, Subarnarekha Mahavidyalaya is a co-educational undergraduate college, situated in the pastoral setting of Gopiballavpur, a rural place in the south-western regions of Jhargram District, West Bengal. On the banks of the river Subarnarekha or the river Golden Line, this verdurous seat of learning, its beauty and elegance being glammed up not by palatial buildings but with a well-decorated green campus and zealous academic ambience, is just about 40 km away from the district town, Jhargram. It comes under the geo-political region called “Jangal-Mahal”, a linguistically-varied and culturally-diversified area which is mostly populated by the tribal people and splendidly enriched with their living and throbbing art and culture. This sylvan place on the borderlines of Orissa, Jharkhand and West Bengal (encompassed by Orissa, on one hand and Jharkhand, on the other) is well-decked with sporadically sublime presence of Sal, Piyasal and Mahua, and a not-far-off ecological park. The river Subarnarekha flowing by the place on the eastern side adds up serenity to the setting.

## **THE DREAM AND THE REALITY:**

### **PAST AND PRESENT**

As there was no scope of higher education within a radius of 45Kms, the intellectual polity and a few undaunted enthusiasts with indomitable spirit and insatiable yearning for higher education had, for years after the Independence in 1947, been dreaming of an institution for higher education. Their sincere endeavour and untiring efforts got realized as Subarnarekha Mahavidyalaya was ultimately established on 7th September 1988 on the land donated by Nayabasan Janakalyan Vidyapeeth, a premier school in the locality. With 19 students and a small room, the college started its journey on 1st July, 1988 with B. Com. only. It received recognition from the government of West Bengal on 30th August, 1988. It got its affiliation to Vidyasagar University on 31st March, 1990 w.e.f the session 1988-89, whereas on 05<sup>th</sup> November, 1992, the college got the UGC registration under Section 2(f) as framed under section 12(b). In 1990, the college first offered honours course in Accountancy, then gradually it embellished itself with honours courses in Geography, Anthropology, English, Bengali, History, Sanskrit and Santali. We are looking forward to march on by introducing

honours courses in a few more subjects. The college can now boast of producing graduates in all the three streams- Arts, Science and Commerce. The college which at its nascent days had only a few students can now boast of almost 2300 students.

Initially, people from all walks of life donated for the construction of its building. And the college is marching forward with financial help from honorable M.P., M.L.A and well-wishers. The college authority has been thinking of erecting a new building. The college is now providing free wireless internet access throughout the campus.

## **OUR MISSION AND VISION:**

Most of the students coming to this college are from families with low socio-economic background. Many of the students are even first-generation learners and it is a real challenge to impart quality education to them. We are confident that together we will fulfil the dreams that the early pioneering figures of this college once dreamt of. The aim of the college is to impart education with skills and perspectives needed for understanding and participating responsibly and creatively in life beyond the college. Our aim is to offer all students a range of opportunities so that they can achieve to the best of their ability within a framework of shared values and standards.

# GENERAL REGULATIONS OF UG CBCS, VU

## Related to UG Admission:

- Admission to UG programmes is governed by the guidelines of the VU and the HE Deptt., Govt. of West Bengal.
- A candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the undergraduate programme at a time.
- Candidates passing HS or any other equivalent board/council are eligible for admission in UG programme within 3 (Three) consecutive years from the date of passing.
- An applicant may be asked to produce a special permission letter from the VU authority in case of any deviation to the above norm.
- Candidates from the recognized Boards/Council (by VU) are eligible for admission to any UG programme. Candidate from new Boards/ Council requires special permission from the VU authority.

## Related to UG Registration:

- Registration is mandatory for pursuing studies in any UG Degree programme under VU.
- Students who wish to change the programme in-between the study to other UG programme need to take special permission from the University Authority for surrendering the old Registration and issuance of new one.
- Candidates who have exhausted 3 (Three) chances for passing any Semester Examination may get admitted in 1st semester as fresh candidate after surrendering the previous Registration and taking special permission of the University Authority.
- Incomplete Registration will not allow a student to sit in the University Examination.

## Related to UG Examination:

- Auto-progression upto Semester-V. All the backlog courses to be cleared within 5th Semester Examination.
- A candidate having any backlog course shall not be permitted to appear in the End Semester Examination of 6th Semester.
- Candidates who have exhausted 3 (Three) chances for passing any Semester Examination may appear to clear the Semester seeking special permission of the University Authority.
- A Candidate shall have to clear all the Semesters within five consecutive years from the academic year of admission in any college.
- Examination form fill-up is mandatory before every University Semester Examination.

## GENERAL ADMISSION CRITERIA CCFUP, VU

Admission criteria, in-take capacity etc. shall be governed according to the guidelines issued by the Government of West Bengal and Vidyasagar University as applicable from time to time. Proposed basic admission criteria applicable only for UG Admission for session 2023-24 with respect to the introduction of CCFUP are as follows:

1. Candidates passing Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or any other equivalent board/ council are eligible for admission in the undergraduate programmes with Single Major and Multidisciplinary Studies under CCFUP within 3 (Three) consecutive academic sessions from the date of passing the qualifying examination.
2. Candidates passing Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) from Vocational stream conducted by the respective Board/ Council for vocational studies or any other equivalent board/council are eligible for admission in the undergraduate programmes in Multidisciplinary Studies only within 3 (Three) consecutive academic sessions from the date of passing the qualifying examination.
3. Candidates must have passed in 5 (Five) recognized subjects (excluding Environmental Studies) including at least one language subject in the qualifying examination.
4. Students who have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent examination with minimum 45% marks in the Aggregate (to be calculated by adding the marks obtained in 'Best Five' subjects excluding Environmental Studies) along with pass in the subject/related subject or 50% marks in the subject or related subject are eligible to apply for admission in the Single Major (Honours/Honours with Research) programmes.
5. Students carrying pass marks in Higher Secondary or equivalent examination with at least pass in five subjects (excluding Environmental Studies) are eligible to apply for Multidisciplinary programmes under CCFUP. Students from Vocational stream are eligible to apply for Multidisciplinary Studies only fulfilling the other criteria.
6. Other UG admission criteria regarding merit point calculation and subject/programme specific requirements shall be as per previous, as applicable.

**# Academic Bank of Credit (ABC):** Students must obtain ABC ID during the admission process.

## **RULES FOR ADMISSION**

1. One may fill up more than one application form following the eligibility criteria as mentioned in the admission norms (Given Below).
2. Please read the instructions for Online form fill-up and follow accordingly.
3. Only regular candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary/equivalent examination eligible for apply within 3 (Three) consecutive academic sessions from the date of passing the qualifying examination.
4. Please note that if any candidate fails to fulfill the eligibility criteria or put false statement his/her candidature will automatically be cancelled at any point of admission procedure and strict action will be taken in such cases. The college authority will not be responsible for any such cancellation.
5. Admission charges to be submitted during admission as per our schedule.
6. Application must maintain the subject combination strictly as per our prescribed subject bunching.
7. At the time of verification, they must bring the; 1) Online submitted admission form duly signed by the applicant; 2) Fee Receipt (in original); 3) All originals Testimonials along with following self-attested copies of testimonial.
  - a) Self attested copies of 10th Standard (Madhyamik) Admit Card,

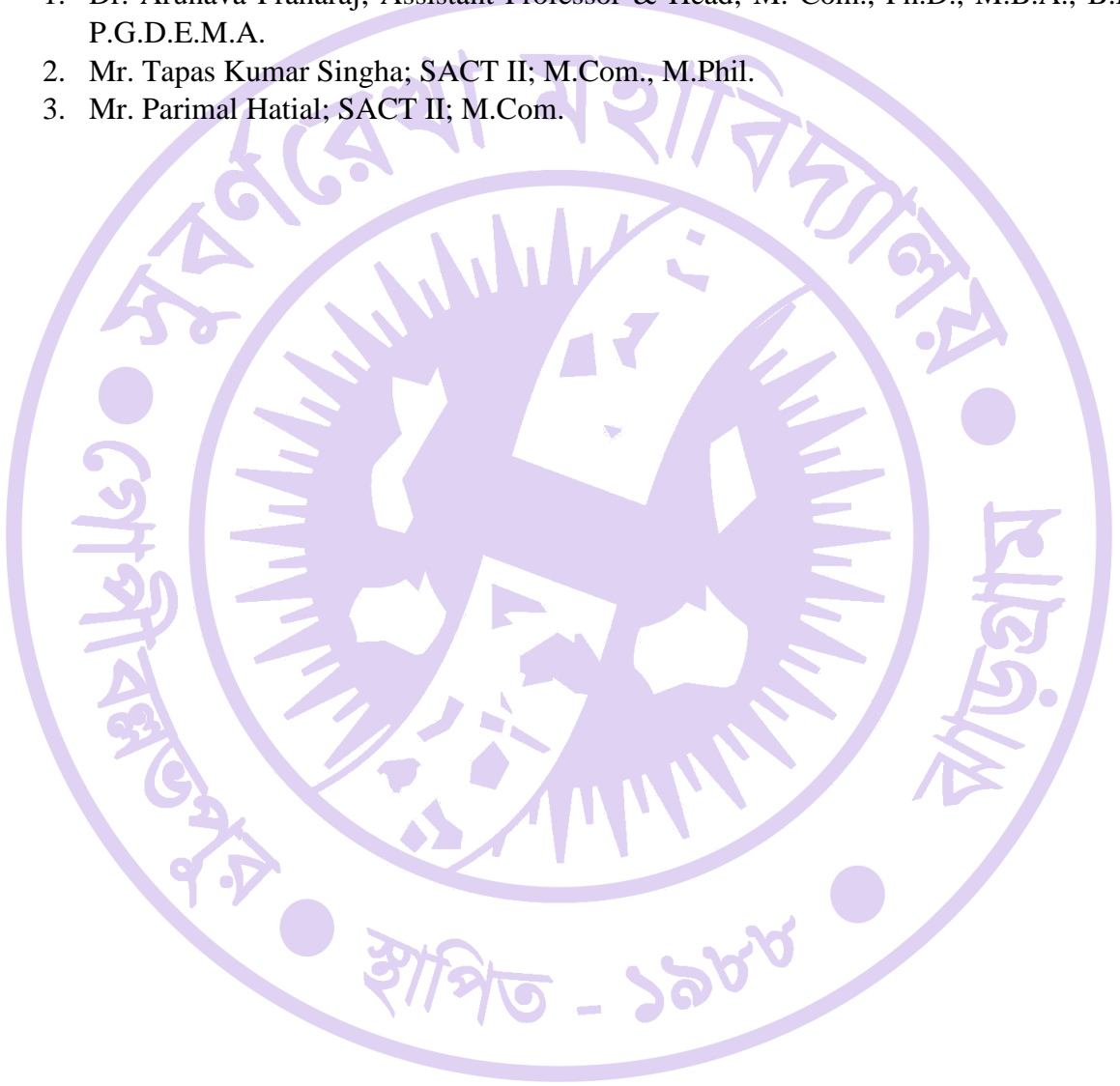
